**The Society of St Vincent De Paul (SVP)** was founded in Paris in 1833 to help the disadvantages in the local communities. Its foundation was inspired by the dedicated life of a French Catholic Priest (now a saint) Vincent de Paul who spent his life serving the poor.

We have recently set up a branch of the SVP. It is based in St Mary's but is (uniquely) a project of all the five parishes in Ipswich.

The gap between rich and poor is widening and the number of people trying to cope on their own, with illness, old age, debt and disability, is increasing. This is true here in Ipswich, as elsewhere. People in these situations need help.

**Could you work with us, to put your concern into action?**

**What do we do?** Help those locally who are suffering poverty in whatever form: loneliness, isolation, illness, material poverty,

**How do we work?** By visiting (in twos-a few times a month) homes and extending the hand of friendship and, if asked, assess the needs.
